Internship Length: The length of the internship can be tailored to the students needs. Typically, the busiest period of time for both field and office experience is April-June and August-October. We are able to offer the intern up to 35 hours per week. We can also fit our internship into the student's school program. Summer internships are available.

Pay: This is an unpaid internship

Brief Description of Internship: Interns will get hands on experience assisting with and delivering environmental and educational programs for water quality monitoring for Stream Leaders teachers and their students and adult volunteers through the Adopt-A-Stream program. Interns will have opportunities to work both in an office setting, at local events and in the field with teachers and students and volunteers. All applicants should be extremely motivated and dedicated to providing quality programs. The successful candidate will gain experience in:

- leading groups of students during water quality monitoring events
- leading groups of adult volunteers during water quality monitoring events
- facilitate table top activities at area events
- hands on science for environmental events

The length of the internship and the start and end dates are negotiable. Interns will be expected to work 3-5 days a week, some of which may be a Saturday or Sunday. Daytime hours and some evening hours are required.

Qualifications/Skills Required: Strong written and verbal communication skills; Good Organization Skills; Strong Leadership Skills; Ability to work with public; Critical Thinking Ability; Strong Problem Solving Skills; Ability to Work Both Independently and Cooperatively; Follow Up Abilities; Available to work some nights or weekends.

What to Expect:

- You will get an orientation
- You will get your own work space (may be shared by another volunteer or staff member)
- We will work together on developing a tentative work schedule according to your availability
